With sentiments from noted scholars and everyday people, *DIScerning disABILITY* forces its viewers to reexamine notions they previously held and thought they understood.

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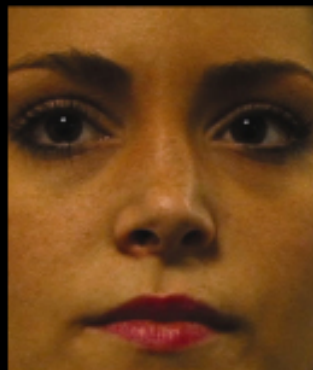
